EPA Secures \$165 Million Agreement with Occidental Chemical to Conduct the Work Needed to Start the Cleanup of the Lower Eight Miles of the Passaic River

Statement of Debbie Mans, Baykeeper and Executive Director, NY/NJ Baykeeper

"This is a good first step, but now the rest of the polluters need to step up and take responsibility for cleaning up the Passaic River. The remaining polluters that make up the "Cooperating Parties Group" or "CPG" have financially benefited by not properly disposing of their toxics - instead, they use the Passaic River as its dumping ground. It is time for the remaining polluters to stop paying their lobbyists and lawyers and start paying for the cleanup of the River. It is time for the polluters to stop paying for fish swaps and out-of-river projects as a way to distract from their obligation to return the Passaic River to the community. What is significant about this announcement is that it paves the way to move forward with the cleanup, as the \$165 million is to perform engineering and design work needed to begin the cleanup. This work could take a couple of years and the sooner it is started, the better."
