## **Working with Seventh Graders to Reduce Plastic Pollution**



We've teamed up with seventh graders in Berkeley Heights to reduce plastic pollution in their local waterway, the Passaic River. Students collected plastic bottles to create sculptures of animals impacted by plastic waste. Students created a true-to-size 6 foot sea turtle and a killer whale 1/5 actual size. Going forward, we'll be working with Berkeley Heights Middle School to organize litter cleanups, and a school lunch plastic survey.
