June 12th - Bronx River Oyster Reef Monitoring



Volunteer at our Bronx River oyster reef this season! You'll have the opportunity to don waders and check out oyster biology up close! Volunteers help us by measuring our oysters for growth, survivorship, and biodiversity. We'll be checking up on the oysters a few days a month, including weekends, mornings, and afternoons. Team Oyster is Back in Action!

Team Oyster is kicking off the 2017 field season! Our setting tanks are loaded with oyster castles and ready to receive hundreds of thousands of baby oysters. Once the oysters are attached and have grown a bit, the castles will be moved out to the 0.91 acre Living Shoreline project area at NWS Earle. This summer we will be adding an additional 400 oyster castles with oysters attached to the Living Shoreline started in summer 2016. Based on initial data from 2016's installment, we anticipate continued placement of oyster castles at this location will increase sedimentation on the shore ward side of the project site, will dampen the energy of waves approaching the coastline, and reduce erosion of the intertidal marsh adjacent to Ware Creek.

Research at this site also shows structures seeded with oysters increase species diversity by contributing 3 dimensional habitat to the mudflat.

NY/NJ Baykeeper and partners Rutgers CUES and NJCU will continue the research started last year using sediment traps, settlement plates, and fish traps to monitor sediment deposition, epi faunal and benthic communities, and fish and invertebrate species. We can't wait to get out on the oyster skiff and get our divers in the water!
